About the Position:

We value collaboration and teamwork. Our radiation oncologists work on care teams that include nurses, pharmacists, radiation therapists, clinical associates, dietitians, speech-language therapists, social workers, volunteers and other colleagues.

Our services include active HDR gynecologic and prostate brachytherapy programs, established SRS brain and SBRT lung programs, with plans to expand in the future.

Our oncologists are members of clinical trial groups including Alliance, NCIC, CTG and NRG. They are eligible for a clinical appointment in the Division of Oncology, College of Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan and are also involved in teaching medical students and Residents including at the undergraduate and graduate level.

Education

- Degree in Medicine with subspecialty training in internal medicine and radiation oncology

Experience

- Fellowship in Radiation Oncology with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent education and experience

Credentials

- Must be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan
- Must be eligible for membership and privileges with the Saskatchewan Health Authority

Other

- Eligible for Canadian Medical Protective Association (CMPA) coverage or equivalent
- Written and verbal fluency in English
